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

Face coverings/masks are required to be worn on campus all the time. Except while eating or drinking during designated meal and break times. Two important policy updates are:


- Neck gaiters and neck buffs are no longer permitted.

8th Grade Students & Parents

Your 8th grade student may qualify for the Horizon Scholars Program, a mentoring and scholarship college access program that culminates in a 2-year Florida pre-paid scholarship, which can be used at any college or University in Florida! The Valencia College Horizon Scholars Program will be selecting new students during the 2020-2021 school year. Selected students will begin the program in the fall of 9th grade.

Students are selected based on three criteria:

1. Academic performance – students must have an unweighted GPA of 2.5 or higher
2. Family income level
3. An interview, where the student demonstrates a desire to pursue a post-secondary education
