Falcon Band Makes Their Mark in Florida

This year the Forest Hill Band Department has left their mark in the State of Florida. Throughout the year they participated in all of the usual events that assessed their musical performances. Their first event was back in October when they traveled to Lehigh Acres to participate in a Marching Band Competition and their final event was during Spring Break where several students traveled to Seminole Florida

to participate in the State Solo & Ensemble Music Performance Assessments.

The following are the some of the outstanding accomplishments of the Band Department: At the Lehigh Tournament and competing in a higher class, our marching Band auxiliary (Color Guard) came in 2nd Place, the Band came in 2nd Place in "Visual performance" and Our Drum Major Nicole Negron received a Superior rating. At the Park Vista Invitational, the Marching Band came in 2nd Place while the auxiliary received Best in Class. And finally, at the State Marching Band Tournament in St Petersburg, the Marching Falcons qualified as a Finalist (top 5 1A bands in Florida) and got to compete in the Tropicana Stadium. Performing in that stadium is the goal of every competitive band in the state.

Some of the other achievements for our Band Department are as follows: After finishing each of their competitions in either 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place, the Forest Hill Winter

Guard came in 2nd Place in the South Florida Winter Guard Championships. The Band (along with our strings) had a record number of Superior ratings at the District Solo and Ensemble Music Performance Assessments. Four students, Michael Amsden, Victor Angel, Caitlin Volante, and Nicole Negron, qualified for State Solo & Ensemble Assessments and all four received Superior Ratings. Lastly, four of our students, Michael Amsden, Victor Angel, Maynor Pacajoj-Diego, and Robert Arreaga, through a competitive audition process were selected as members of the Palm Beach All-County Band.

The Forest Hill Band Department is looking forward to topping these achievements next year.
