## Attendance Policy

In an effort to become the highest performing public high school in the state of Florida, students must be in school. Attendance and graduation are an integral part of what we do at FMHS as it goes hand in hand with student achievement. As such we want to make sure that students have every opportunity to achieve their potential through a tradition of excellence. Our attendance policy outlines attendance expectations, privileges, tardies, skipping, and sign-outs.

- At 5 Unexcused Absences/Tardies/Sign Outs (per semester) - A school counselor will call the student down for a conference and a call is made home.
- At 7+ Unexcused Absences/Tardies/Sign Outs (per semester) - Our Assistant Principal calls for a parent conference with guidance. Attendance contract is put in place with administration.

\*We hold students accountable when they are in violation of the attendance policy by placing them on an attendance contract at 7+ Unexcused Absences/Tardies/Sign-Outs (per semester) and taking away the following privileges:

- Homecoming Dance
- Grad Bash
- Prom
- Parking Permit(student must remit parking pass until further notice)
- Walking at Graduation
- Senior Picnic/Senior Breakfast
- Extra-Curricular Activities (as deemed by administration)

\*Students will be able to earn these privileges back with consecutive attendance to school, being on time for classes and limited sign outs for 30 days. Each day student is absent, contract begins over with day 1. Failure to return a signed contract results in the loss of the same privileges above.

- 10 Unexcused Absences/Tardies/Sign-Outs (per semester)-Social worker is notified and parent must attend an attendance review to discuss possible denial of credit.
- 3 Unexcused Tardies to School may equal an absence-as set forth by the Lee County School District Code of Conduct

## Parent Portal/E-Forms

All parents/guardians must register in the FOCUS Parent Portal as well as complete student directory information and student health information. These online forms must be completed each year even if no information has changed. The following forms are required per the School District of Lee County: Attendance Policy, Integrity Form, Bully Form, and the Code of Conduct Form.

## Discipline

Please refer to the FOCUS discipline guidelines, along with the district code of conduct for more detailed explanations of rules, rights, and responsibilities. Discipline can be viewed in FOCUS via the Parent Portal as well as the student's Chromebook.

## FMHS Student Off-Campus Policy 2021-2022 School Year

### SENIORS:

Must be enrolled in 8 credits unless the student is a senior who has the District permission form completed and approved by school counselor.

If enrolled in an off-campus course, student must submit the appropriate off-campus form to his/her school counselor and obtain a school ID with approved off-campus periods indicated.

### OTHER SITUATIONS:

Seniors and Juniors enrolled full-time at FSW or FGCU do not report to our campus. College entrance/enrollment paperwork/documents are completed by parent/student and approved by counselor or APC.

Seniors and Juniors enrolled part time at FSW or FGCU must submit the appropriate off-campus form to his/her school counselor and obtain a school ID with approved off-campus periods indicated. College entrance/enrollment paperwork/documents are completed by parent /student and approved by counselor or APC.

If enrolled in an OJT course, student must submit the appropriate work documents to the OJT teacher, the off-campus form to his/her school counselor and obtain a school ID with approved off-campus periods indicated.

## New Volunteers

The School District of Lee County promotes volunteerism and supports school-based volunteer coordinators with program information and technical assistance. Individual schools actively recruit parents, businesses, and interested citizens who wish to volunteer in their particular school. Potential volunteers obtain volunteer applications from the school in which they seek to volunteer. Completed volunteer applications should be kept in a secure location. Volunteer applications are subject to public information.

It is the responsibility of each individual school to screen applicants and keep the volunteer application on file for 4 years. Each school is responsible for completing reference checks (optional) and the required Sexual Predator and Sexual Offender screenings. The screening must be completed and documented yearly for each volunteer. If a criminal background check is deemed necessary, it is the school's responsibility to complete. The principal has the right to prohibit the individual from volunteering. The principal must approve all volunteer applicants before they assume volunteer duties.

School personnel have permission to duplicate any materials provided by the District Volunteer Coordinator.

Volunteers are covered under the District's worker's compensation insurance if they require medical treatment for an injury incurred in the course and scope of their volunteer employment. Volunteers who are placed through outside organizations such as Foster Grandparents are covered by that organization's insurance.

### ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

A school volunteer program acts as a vehicle to provide additional educational resources to students, teachers, and other staff members. When each participant works as a team member, the school volunteer program will run as smoothly as any professionally managed program. Each person involved with a school-level volunteer program performs an essential role. The suggested roles and responsibilities determine how each participant will be involved with the school-level volunteer program:

#### Volunteer

- Works as a team member with faculty and staff.
- Follows policies, rules, and regulations.
- Works closely with administrators, teachers and the volunteer contact.
- Follows directions.
- Asks questions when needed for clarification.
- Is responsible, prompt, dependable, and maintains confidentiality.
- Has respect for students and others working with the program.
- Is willing to share ideas, talents, and skills.
- Is willing to serve as an appointed, non-paid employee.
- Recognizes that the teacher has primary instructional responsibilities.

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## Julia Knowler - FMHS Student-Athlete Gatorade Florida Softball Player of the Year

CHICAGO (June 18, 2021) — In its 36<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, Gatorade today announced **Julia Knowler of Fort Myers High School** as its **2020-21 Gatorade Florida Softball Player of the Year**. Knowler is the first Gatorade Florida Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from Fort Myers High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Knowler as Florida's best high school softball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Softball Player of the Year award to be announced in June, Knowler joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Cat Osterman (2000-01, Cy Spring High School, Texas), Kelsey Stewart (2009-10, Arkansas City High School, Kan.), Carley Hoover (2012-13, D.W. Daniel High School, S.C.), Jenna Lilley (2012-13, Hoover High School, Ohio), Morgan Zerke (2012-13, Cabell Midland High School, W. Va.), and Rachel Garcia (2014-15, Highland High School, Calif.).

The 5-foot-9 sophomore right-handed pitcher and infielder led the Green Wave to a 20-6-1 record and the Class 5A state championship this past season. Knowler compiled a 12-2 mark in the circle with a 1.46 earned run average, striking out 117 batters against just 15 walks in 96 innings pitched. The Class 5A Player of the Year, she posted a .582 batting average with eight home runs, 39 runs scored, 35 runs batted in and a 1.268 slugging percentage.

Knowler has volunteered locally as an assistant with a youth after-school program. She has also donated her time as a youth softball coach. "Julia is a dedicated, hard-working and talented ballplayer," said Johnny Manetta, head coach of Fort Myers High. "She has the ability to take control of the game at any time whether it is on the mound, in the field or from the plate."

Knowler has maintained a weighted 4.15 GPA in the classroom. She will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which works with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Knowler joins recent Gatorade Florida Softball Players of the Year Avery Goelz (2019-20, Lakewood Ranch High School), Lexi Kilfoyl (2018-19 & 2017-18, Academy at the Lakes), and Ally Muraskin (2016-17, Coral Springs Charter School), among the state's list of former award winners.

Through Gatorade's cause marketing platform "Play it Forward," Knowler has the opportunity to award a \$1,000 grant to a local or national youth sports organization of their choosing. Knowler is also eligible to submit a 30-second video explaining why the organization they chose is deserving of one of twelve \$10,000 spotlight grants, which will be announced throughout the year. To date, Gatorade Player of the Year winners' grants have totaled more than \$2.7 million across 1,117 organizations.

Since the program's inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.

### Hall Pass Process

At the start of the 2021-2022 school year students will no longer use CASTLE for passes. Each teacher will be provided two hall passes which will be monitored by the teacher. Requesting a hall pass is the students' responsibility. Students are given ten minutes per pass, time extended beyond ten minutes constitutes as skipping and a possible discipline referral.

**A student who leaves the classroom MUST:**

- Ask for teacher permission to leave the classroom.
- Complete the sign-out log before leaving the classroom.
- NOT use electronic devices (cell phones, iPods, headphones, games, etc.) at any time while out of the classroom.

**A student who returns to the classroom MUST:**

- Complete the sign-out log when returning to the classroom.
- Have a signed pass with the date and time if returning from the Clinic, Main Office areas, Media Center, or another teacher.

### Clinic/Clinic Passes

- All medication needs must be documented in the clinic and be accompanied by a Doctor's Authorization letter.
- All students visiting the clinic must notify their teacher or an adult of their need and receive a HANDWRITTEN pass to visit.

### Lunch Procedures

- Lunch locations will be limited to the cafeteria, cafeteria courtyards, and picnic areas outside the cafeteria.
- Fort Myers High School will be a part of the "Community Eligibility Program" for the upcoming 2021-2022 school year. All students will receive breakfast and lunch at no cost.
- We encourage students to participate in the free lunch program at school; be advised that lunch CANNOT be delivered to school during school hours.

### Electronic Device Policy

During instructional time, phones must be off of the student's person and placed in the teacher cell phone holder, in Chromebook sleeves or in backpacks. This includes leaving phones away and off their person when leaving the classroom to go to the restroom, offices, media center, clinic, etc.

### Lockers

Lockers will be sold this year for \$5 before school begins (July 19th - August 9th) and during Open House. Once school begins, students may purchase lockers; before school, during lunch, and after school.

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## Dress Code

- Shorts and Leggings will be **PROHIBITED** for the 2021-2022 school year.
- All skirts worn should be fingertip length/bottoms should not have any skin exposed, rips or frays and should be worn at the waist with a belt, if necessary.
- Sleeveless, bare mid -drift, transparent, or any top depicting illegal substances, inappropriate pictures, messages, etc. are prohibited.
- All shirts/tops must be worn at the waist line with no skin or mid-section exposed.
- No ripped or torn pants or jeans.

## Covid Protocols

- One-way hallways will remain in effect during the 2021-2022 school year. Students must follow directional arrows throughout the building.
- During class change, students will be allowed to use the restroom with a limited number of students in the restrooms.
- Masks will be voluntary.

## Early Student Sign - Out

- Per the School District of Lee County policy 4.16:
  - Students may not be signed-out after 1:05 PM.
  - Guardians who are not listed on the student's school records as an authorized contact will not be permitted to sign the student out of school.
- Students signing out prior to 1:05 PM must be verified by the FMHS Attendance Office.
- Students who drive to school - Email requests for early sign-out must be submitted no later than 8:30 AM on the day of sign-out request.
- The email must include:
  - ✓ a legible copy of the guardian's identification (driver's license or notification sent from parent email registered in FOCUS).
  - ✓ contact information for verification.
- Students who do not drive to school must have a parent sign them out for early release.
