

Bright Futures Scholarship Information

Any senior who applied for the Bright Futures Scholarship between December 1, 2023 and January 31, 2024 will receive an email of their initial award status. Another email notification will be sent in July for students still working on SAT/ACT scores, grade point average, and community service hours. Initial eligibility does not guarantee an award, students must complete their senior year and meet all requirements before the award is finalized. 




Athletics



Culinary Arts

Culinary has been busy this summer. Last year we held 2 different weeks of Career Camp, in cooperation with Student Support Services. Students were invited to learn more about careers within the Culinary field and given the chance to use our facilities to learn some basic culinary skills including measuring, reading and following a recipe, knife skills and more (other camps clusters included cosmetology, barbering, TV Production and Automotive, and multiple SCPS schools were included). This year we expanded on that original plan...we hosted 2 weeks for Culinary 1 where new students were introduced to the program, and 2 weeks of Culinary 2 where students already enrolled in a Culinary class at their home school, or those who had already taken the camp last summer could rejoin and learn new skills and recipes. Each level met for 2 weeks included 4 days working in the classroom and culinary lab, and a Friday Field trip involving different aspects of a career within the Culinary industry.

This summer Culinary 1 had extra time to learn about making a roux and slurries to thicken sauces, extra knife skills and even had the chance to make their own strawberry freezer jam and buttermilk biscuits from scratch! Culinary 2 took on some more complex recipes, many of which required 2 prep days, yeast doughs and different cooking techniques such as searing, caramelizing and creating 2 different layered cakes.

The Culinary 2 camp also took on the added challenge of posting a recipe from their daily menu onto our social media, including pictures and videos, so our followers could make the same dish at home. Follow us to find those recipes! We tried to make sure we included a variety of sweet and savory, and all of them have been "fan favorites" with our Culinary students throughout the school year. Both sections of camp would not have been as successful without the help of our incredible Culinary volunteers. Several students signed up (some for multiple weeks) to be here from 7 am- 2 pm helping to set up, supervise and assist campers. These students were patient, helpful and in high spirits.
