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A Message from the Principal

Dear Ram Families,

The Lake Mary High School faculty, staff, and administration are excited to have our students back on campus for in-person learning and are working to offer your children a quality educational experience in a safe and supportive learning environment. We have many programs of support in place to meet the diverse needs of our student population, including a focus on building relationships through Restorative Practices. Further, we look forward to partnering with families throughout the school year in hopes of ensuring that your child reaches his or her full academic potential. Following is a list of recommendations for how families can make sure your children are successful in school.

1. **Get and Stay Connected:** Access Skyward regularly to monitor your child's progress, and communicate with your child's teachers if you have questions, concerns, or if you'd like to request additional information regarding resources that may help your child master course standards. Be aware of what's happening in your student's school life and *TALK ABOUT IT*. Your interest and involvement has a tremendous effect on your child's performance and attitude at school.
2. **Establish a Solid Home Study Routine:** Encouraging and supporting this vital activity will improve your child's attitude and performance at school and instill a work ethic that endures for a lifetime. SET A SCHEDULE. Establish a regular timeslot for this important daily activity. Seek your child's agreement and commitment to reserve this time each day for homework and study. CREATE THE ENVIRONMENT. Students can be easily distracted. Teach them to create an atmosphere conducive for concentration. Minimizing social media access, loud music, and other detractors will improve effectiveness and retention. Having a defined study area works with some students but not all. The most important factor is the discipline of doing it every day. OBSERVE AND ENGAGE. Psychologists suggest that it takes three weeks to break or establish a habit. Commit three weeks to assisting with your student's daily routine. Make good homework practices a habit for both of you.
3. **Make Daily Attendance the Expectation:** Very few things have as much negative effect on academic performance as poor attendance. Be clear in your attitude towards attending school every day. In the event of your child missing school due to COVID or quarantine, make sure you and your child are communicating with teachers and accessing eCampus to keep up with missed work to the best extent possible. And remember, students have one day for every day absent, plus one day, to make up work upon their return to school.
4. **Encourage Extra-Curricular Activity:** Involvement in any of our clubs, sports, and arts programs improves academic performance, attendance, and discipline issues. We have something for everyone! Participation in these activities enhances school life and looks good on college and job applications. Also, help your child plan and execute community service, which is a requirement for earning *Bright Futures* scholarship money.
5. **Help Your Child Plan for Post-Secondary:** Talk to your child about career interests and passions. We have information about college and career resources in the Student Services tab on our website. No matter what your child dreams of doing after graduation, planning for the next step is a wise choice. Post high school education contributes to a better quality of life. But whether or not your child goes on to a college, university, technical school, or the world of work, the information and skills they learn in high school will always be important. Everyone, in every kind of job, needs to be able to write and speak clearly, listen carefully, understand what is written and spoken, and use math effectively.

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

This semester school counselors will facilitate grade level orientations to equip our students with tools that will help them adjust to LMHS. 
Feature Student: Anika Kinnear

Positive Behavior Supports

At LMHS we make a concerted effort to focus on positive behaviors. We do this through an initiative known as Positive Behavior Supports (PBS). PBS offers a systematic approach to promoting a school wide culture focused on respect and positive behavior. Because students come from different backgrounds and cultures, they may view behavior in their own unique ways. When a student acts out, LMHS views it as a skill deficit; as a result, students are taught appropriate school behaviors and expectations. Consequences are still given for inappropriate behavior; however, students are also rewarded when they model citizenship.

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

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Testing

ACT: The ACT will be given at Lake Mary High School on Tuesday, October 5th to all 11th grade students. All students will take the ACT free of charge and there will not be any make-ups.

PSAT: The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT NMSQT) will be given at Lake Mary High School on Wednesday, October 13th to all 9th, 10th and 11th grade students. For juniors, the PSAT is the only avenue to the National Merit Scholarship Program. For sophomores and freshmen, PSAT scores are used to qualify for registration in some Advanced Placement courses. All students will take the PSAT free of charge and there will not be any make-ups.

SAT: The SAT will be given at Lake Mary High School on Wednesday, October 13th to all 12th grade students. All students will take the SAT free of charge and there will not be any make-ups.

National SAT / ACT Testing Dates

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Lake Mary Athletics – Online Sports Physical Submission Information

All sports physicals in Seminole County will be submitted online for clearance to participate in athletics. As a parent, this process eliminates the need to "DROP" your paperwork at the school or "SEND" it with your student-athlete. We look forward to the numerous benefits that this system will provide for you, your student-athlete, our coaches and the LMHS Athletic Department.

ALL athletes interested in participating in athletics at Lake Mary **MUST COMPLETE** the below process.

Documents to have on hand: Physical, Insurance Card, Parent Dr. License and Birth Certificate.

1. Visit www.AthleticClearance.com and choose your state.
2. Register and complete the 7 fields including a security question. Parents MUST register with a valid email username and password.
3. You will be asked to submit an activation code that will be displayed on the screen. Enter the code and click submit.
4. Login using your email address and password that you registered with.
5. Select "Start Clearance Here" to start the process.
6. Select "School Year", select "School", Select "Sport" in which the student plans to participate in first. (you can select other sports later)
 - a. Example 2020-2021, Lake Mary, Football
7. Complete all required fields for
 - a. Student Information- **Please use legal name as appears in Skyward!**
 - b. Student Uploads-
 - i. If you have a current physical on file in the athletic office we can upload it. Remember a physical dated from your doctor lasts 365 days.
 - ii. If you have played a sport at Lake Mary we can verify your birth certificate. 9th graders and transfers need to provide this upload.
 - iii. Please upload a picture of your insurance card. If you have school insurance we will verify coverage in the athletic office.
 - iv. **Parent Driver's License- used to confirm parent consent.**
 - c. Medical History- Answer all questions and provide necessary information.
 - d. Signature Forms- Parents and Students sign each form.
8. Optional Donation to your athletic program.
9. Once you reach the **Confirmation Message** you have completed the process.
10. If you would like to register for additional sports you may check off those sports below the Confirmation Message. Electronic signatures will be applied to the additional sports/activities.
11. All of this data will be electronically filed with your school's athletic department for review. When the student has been **cleared for participation**, an email notification will be sent.

Note: Participation in a program for conditioning, open facilities, tryouts, or practice can not occur until you have been notified by the athletic department of your clearance status.

Athletic Eligibility Requirements

All student athletes entering the ninth grade must have been promoted from the 8th grade and maintain a 2.0 grade point average.

Each athlete must complete and pass a physical prior to trying out in any sport; this includes any pre-season conditioning practice. All physicals must be signed by a parent/guardian. Physical forms are available below, in the front office, guidance and the athletic office; however, the process is now electronic. Go to athleticclearance.com to submit the required documents.
