- High-Level Questions: We are committed to promoting critical thinking and problem-solving skills by encouraging our teachers to ask high-level questions in the classroom. Our district has paired up with the Center for Model Schools to help us identify areas of growth for our staff.

We believe that by focusing on these areas, we can create a positive and supportive learning environment where all students can thrive. Some tips to help ensure the success of vour child:

Choosing your "E": We are encouraging all students to "choose their E". Please speak to your child about one of these three options:

- ♦ Enroll enrolling in college or trade school after high school
- ♦ Enlist enlisting in a branch of the military after high
- Employ entering the workforce directly after high school

By choosing your "E", it will help us to guide your child towards their goals. Going forward, students will be using a program • called Xello to help with career planning.

- Access FOCUS: Our online student information system, to review your child's grades from last year. Talk with your child about areas of strength and areas that need improvement. Set achievement goals for the current school year and discuss specific strategies that will help your child achieve those goals.
- **Access FOCUS**: to learn the results of the accountability tests your child took during the Spring testing season. On all exams, level 3 and above represent proficiency, while levels 1 and 2 indicate your child did not earn a proficient score. Remember that the 10th grade FAST ELA and the BEST Algebra I EOC are the only two standardized tests students are required to pass in order to earn a high school diploma. If your child did not earn a proficient score on either of those tests, know that they will have multiple opportunities to be re-tested. However, you should discuss with your child a plan for improving their test score. If you need assistance with this task, please make an appointment with your child's guidance counselor.
- Attendance is important. Studies have found that students attending school daily have greater success in school and are more likely to graduate. Teachers prepare lessons for each school day and students attending school regularly will be able to keep up with the progression of learning in the classroom. Charlotte County has a new attendance policy for students. We sent home a contract to begin the year that reminds students that anyone missing more than 20% of instructional time will be withheld from extracurricular activities.
- **Exam Exemptions**: New this year, all students who meet certain attendance criteria can exempt Midterms and Final Exams, in the past, this was isolated to seniors. The threshold for exam exemptions are:

- ♦ 5 or less absences (unexcused and excused) combined) - per period
- 5 or less tardies per period
- At least a "B" average in the course
- No out of school suspensions
- ♦ AICE/AP classes are at the discretion of the teacher.
- Access FOCUS: weekly to monitor your child's current grades. Students will have classwork and homework that will help them prepare for the tests they will take in each of their classes to show learning is occurring. If students start to fall behind, it can be very difficult to catch up. This vear Lemon Bay will offer four days of tutoring after school in the media center. Starting the week of August 26th, we will offer tutoring for one-hour (2:30 – 3:30) Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. New this year, we are offering tutoring Wednesdays from 2:30 - 4:30 and providing transportation to students residing in Charlotte County. To be eligible for the 5:00 bus, families will need to fill out the permission form located on our website.
- **Involvement**: Encourage your child to get involved in extra-curricular activities. Your child could join a club, try out for a sport, or participate in band, chorus, theater, or NJROTC. Involvement in sports, activities, and clubs will help students feel more a part of the high school, and data has shown that students who are involved in high school have better attendance and grades.
- **Active engagement**: Finally, speak with your children about actively engaging in their education. If they have questions about what is being taught in class, they should speak up and ask for help. If your child has guestions about their schedules or about graduation requirements, they should schedule an appointment to talk with a counselor. If your child has concerns about safety issues, they need to approach an administrator. My door is always open to students, and so are the doors of all members of our administrative team. We want to know if our students. or parents, have concerns so that we can work together to resolve those concerns.

The entire staff is looking forward to a great and challenging school year. We are excited to see what this new school year will bring and look forward to partnering with you to ensure your child's success. As always, Go Mantas!!!

bullying behaviors do not occur. Keep in the mind, the following "RIP" acronym if you are unsure if bullying is occurring and should be reported:

- R = Repeated (occurs more than once)
- I = Imbalance of Power (is the victim perceived as younger, weaker, less smart, or less socially accepted)
- P = Purposeful (it was deliberate or intended, not accidental)

What is Bullying? Bullying, which includes cyberbullying, occurs when a person or group of people repeatedly hurt, embarrass, or frighten another person. Cyberbullying means bullying through the use of technology or any electronic communication regardless of whether the bullying occurs on or off school grounds. Examples of cyberbullying include but are not limited to: text/instant messaging, e-mails, creation of a webpage impersonating another person and/or other electronic means through the internet.

### **Bullying is not:**

- An altercation between equals
- Good natured playful teasing among equals or peers
- An isolated incident

You can report a bully situation on our school's website using the "Report Bullying" button. You can also talk to an Assistant Principal about a situation you feel needs reported. Remember, we are here to help!

# Attendance and Extracurricular Activities

The School Board maintains that daily school attendance is essential to the educational success of each student. Students are expected to be in school all day, every day and in class on time in order to receive full benefit from the instructional programs of the Charlotte County Public Schools.

At Lemon Bay High School, a student needs to be in good standing regarding attendance, academics and discipline in order to participate in "extracurricular" activities. Students failing to adhere to the requirements below may be subject to being withheld from extracurricular activities.

Extracurricular activities include, but are not limited to: athletics, co-curricular (Band, ROTC, Theatre), Homecoming, Prom and clubs. Students could also lose access to parking privileges, OJT periods, driver's license (through DMV revocation), attending events at school (athletics/productions/concerts), walking in graduation commencement, etc.

### Requirements:

- Attendance absences not to exceed 20% of lost instructional time per period.
- Academics 2.0 unweighted GPA or above and passing all core classes needed for graduation.

\*If less than a 2.0 weighted GPA, current grades need to be 2.0 or greater

Discipline – no zero tolerance referrals and no repeat OSS/ISS infractions

\*Lemon Bay High School believes prevention is key. If a student fails to meet one of the above requirements, a parent/student/administration meeting will be held to create an improvement plan to possibly restore lost privileges and get back on track for graduation.
