
# Principal's Message: The Most Wonderful Time of Year

# Absences and Convenience

**Absence Form** 

Ohio HB410, known at the attendance law, was signed in Dec 2016. This law is what drives the attendance procedures in schools including our attendance policies. Students that are 38 hours or more of absences are considered "excessively absent" and those who obtain 30 consecutive hours, 42 hours within 1 month, or 72 hours in the year are considered "habitually truant". This policy is 5200 and located on page 16 of the student handbook. For these reasons, it is very important to obtain a note whenever possible regarding absences.

Because of this law, student vacations are not considered excused absences. These hours of missed instruction count towards these hours. Maumee City Schools requests that families that need to take a vacation during the school year, complete the convenience absence form. This informs the families of their options and also communicates with the school. While teachers are not required to provide work while a student is absent, they sometimes have the ability to do so. If your family has a vacation planned during the school year, please get a convenience absence form from the office for your student prior to leaving for vacation.



# **Graduation Academic Recognition**

Graduating students at Maumee High School receive individual academic recognition at the graduation ceremony based on the *Latin Honors System* and the earning of a *State of Ohio Honors Diploma*. Every student who earns an honors diploma will receive an academic medallion at the graduation ceremony and will be recognized by name for that award. The earning of an honors diploma is NOT based on taking any honors courses, it is simply the culmination of 4 years of a prescribed college preparatory curriculum. To earn a state of Ohio academic honors diploma, the student must complete any 7 of the following 8 criteria:

- 1. 4 credits of English
- 2. 4 credits of Math including Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, and a higher level math
- 3. 4 credits of Science including 2 credits of Advanced Science
- 4. 4 credits of Social Studies
- 5. 3 credits of the same Foreign Language or 2 credits in two different languages
- 6. 1 credit of Fine Arts
- 7. 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- 8. 27 Composite on the ACT

# **MHS Prepares Students for the Act**

On <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 11th</u> all Juniors will take a timed, full-length practice test during the school day in order to prepare for the Statewide Act later in March. To prepare our juniors for performing at their highest possible level, MHS teachers have embedded ACT questions and testing strategies into course curriculum as well. Previously, Juniors have taken two full-length practice ACTs during their 9th and 10th grade year. <u>Any PENTA Juniors interested in taking the Practice ACT Tuesday</u>, <u>February 11th should contact the Main Office Secretary Mrs. Kolacki at KKolacki@maumeek12.org</u>. This practice test will be scored and shared with students. Juniors should bring an ACT approved calculator. Juniors are considered "college ready" if they meet ALL 4 of the college-ready subscores (shown below):

#### **ACT College Readiness Benchmarks**

English - 18 Mathematics - 22 Reading - 22 Science - 23

On <u>Tuesday, March 11, 2024</u>, every junior (including PENTA Juniors) will take part in the statewide administration of the ACT test. The state of Ohio pays for this administration and it is the only time that they do so. At the same time, <u>FRESHMEN</u> and <u>SOPHOMORES</u> will take a full-length, timed practice ACT. The practice tests will be scored and returned to the freshmen & sophomores. This is all part of our holistic and ongoing ACT Preparation for all Maumee High School students. <u>Juniors must bring an ACT approved calculator to this.</u> <u>Freshmen & Sophomores should bring an ACT approved calculator as well.</u> All students participating will be dismissed home at the conclusion of testing on this day.

Be sure you are receiving all messages sent out via School Messenger.

We want to be sure you are receiving SMS text messages. We recently found that some families never opted in to receive SMS text messages or may have opted out by mistake.

Maumee City Schools utilizes School Messenger for all types of messaging to parents - including events, school closings, safety alerts, and more.

SchoolMessenger will deliver SMS text messages straight to your mobile phone - but only with your permission.

If you are not receiving SMS text messages from the school district and/or your child's school, you can participate in this free service just by sending a text message of "Y" or "Yes" to 67587.

Type the code directly into your mobile phone or use this OR code.





Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes: SMS stands for Short Message Service and is commonly referred to as a "text message." Most cell phones support this type of text messaging. You can opt out of these messages at any time by replying to one of our messages with "stop". SchoolMessenger is compliant with the Student Privacy Pledge, so you can be assured that your information is safe and will not be given or sold to anyone. SchoolMessenger uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure, and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers.
