ATHLETIC EVENTS BAG POLICY **FOR ALL SARASOTA COUNTY** SCHOOLS

Tony Miller, Athletic Director

Similar to policies found at professional sporting events, Sarasota County Schools has a clear bag policy to ensure the safety of all athletes and spectators. Spectators may carry a small clutch bag and/or a clear plastic bag up to 12" by 12" by 6." Specific prohibited items are listed on the infographic and include but are not limited to: outside food or drink, wheeled equipment such as skateboards, laser pointers, tobacco products, weapons, noisemakers, and anything that may disturb the view or walkway of another spectator (such as selfie sticks).

APPROVED BAGS

- Clear plastic, vinyl or PVC bags that do not exceed 12"W x 12" H x 6"D
- One-gallon clear plastic bag (Ziploc bag or similar)

 Purse or a small clutch bag approximately the size of a hand, with or without a handle or strap (can be carried separately or within a plastic bag

NON-APPROVED BAGS



PROHIBITED ITEMS

Anyone possessing PROHIBITED items will be asked to return them to their cars, take them to one of our Bag Check stations or dispose of them in the garbage cans provided at the gate.

- Alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs

ID BADGES <u>MANDATORY</u> PART OF DRESS CODE

Student ID cards are required to be worn visibly at all times while on campus.

School safety is our #1 priority! During the first week of school, students will have a designated time when they will have their photo taken for their Student ID. Once they receive their ID, students MUST wear them on their person at all times. Students who lose their ID will be charged a \$5 replacement fee.

As a district and as a school, we have put into place measures to ensure that all students have their ID on their person at all times. It is part of our dress code, classroom rules, and campuswide guidelines.

Dress Code updates for 2023-2024 may be found along with the Student Handbook on the NPHS official website at http://northporthighschool.net.

The Sarasota County School District has established procedural guidelines for student dress, in accordance with School Board Policy 5.37.

Individual schools are expected to use the District dress code guidelines as minimum standards and are encouraged to extend their own standards to meet the uniqueness of their school community. Schools are encouraged to obtain input from school stakeholders, including parents, staff and students as they establish a school dress code policy. The principal's decision on the appropriateness of dress will be final. Refusal to comply with the school's dress code policy is an infraction under this code.

Students have a RIGHT to:

- Wear appropriate clothes or the school uniform, as long as those clothes or the way the clothes are worn are appropriate for the school setting, adhere to the school dress code, are not dangerous to health or safety, and do not disrupt the learning environment.
- Learn without being offended or disrupted by the way other students are dressed.
 Comply with the school dress code.

Students have a RESPONSIBILITY to:

- Be respectful of their peers at all times regardless of what they are wearing.
- Come to school fully clothed and wear clothes which are not dangerous to health or safety, do not disrupt the learning process, and stay within the school dress code.
- Dress in a way not offensive to others at school or at school-sponsored events, including, but not limited to:

♦ No:

- exposed undergarments
- jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants worn below the hips
- jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants with rips above the mid-thigh
- jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants with the inseam or outseam shorter than the mid-thigh
- · pajamas or slippers
- excessively low-cut tops
- see-through clothing (includes mesh material mid-thigh and above)
- clothing of an ethnic or racially offensive nature
- Clothing must cover the mid-riff when standing naturally
- Sleeveless shirts must have straps with a minimum width of one inch (about two fingers) and the gap below the armpit cannot be excessive of three inches (about four fingers)
- Not wear items or markings which are offensive, suggestive, indecent, or associated with gangs; as identified by the Florida Gang Intent Act of 1990.
- Not wear items which encourage the use of drugs, tobacco, alcohol, violence, weapons, or support discrimination on account of race, color, religion, ethnic or national origin, age, disability, veteran or military status, marital status, pregnancy, sex, gender, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, or any other characteristic protected by federal or state law or School Board policy.

*Principal or principal designee decisions about dress code are final.
