LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear PJHS Families,

It amazes us how talented and skilled our students are at growing. We encourage everyone to try and experience this, whether it's an athletic event, music concert, theater performance or a club activity.


Thank you again for your support of your students, our staff and our PJHS Community.

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

Important Numbers to Know!

Safer Ohio School Tip Line - 844-723-3764

This is a free service that accepts calls and texts 24/7 and allows anyone to anonymously share information with school officials and law enforcement about threats to safety.

Crisis Text Line - text "4hope" to 741 741

People of all ages may reach out by text 24/7 to communicate with someone trained to listen and respond in a method that is free, private, secure and confidential. Data usage while texting Crisis Text Line is free and the number will not appear on a phone bill with the mobile service carrier.

988 Lifeline

The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline is a national network of over 200 local, independent, and state-funded crisis centers equipped to help people in emotional distress or experiencing a suicidal crisis. By transitioning to 988, the goal is that the three-digit number will be an easier way to access a strengthened and expanded network of crisis call centers. Since July 16, 2022, people in a mental health or addiction crisis can access the Lifeline via 988 or by the 10-digit number 1-800-273-8255. Ohio has 19 Lifeline providers who are actively answering calls in Ohio. In our community, our Lifeline provider is through Lima. Additionally, we have the Wood County Crisis Line that is still available: 419-502-4673. The Wood County Crisis Line is still active and can be called for crisis services in Wood County.

How is 988 different from 911?

988 was established to improve access to crisis services in a way that meets our country's growing suicide and mental health related crisis care needs. 988 will provide easier access to the Lifeline network and related crisis resources, which are distinct from 911 (where the focus is on dispatching emergency medical services and police as needed).

Suicide prevention lessons were taught in 1st semester Health classes. 7th grade Students learned a 3 Step Procedure on "How to Help a Friend in Need." It is called A.C.T. (Acknowledge, Care, Tell). 7th graders that have Health 2nd semester will get this lesson at that time. Please ask your child about this lesson.

8th Grade WEB Leaders taught their 1st Lesson on Cooperation to their 7th grade groups. October's Lesson will be on Study Skills. Great Job, WEB Leaders!




