Immunization Requirements for Incoming 7th Grade Students

If your 6th grader is up to date with immunizations and has already obtained the Florida DH680 Certificate of Immunizations form for 2016 7th Grade entry, the Florida Department of Health in Seminole County congratulates you and applauds your diligence. If your child is not up to date, however, we strongly encourage you to make an appointment now with your child's primary provider to obtain the required immunizations and school form to avoid missed days of school in August. If your Medicaid-assigned medical home is the Florida Department of Health in Seminole County, we urge you to come now and avoid long lines and waits in August.

A Tdap booster (adult strength tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) is required before your child can begin the school year 2016-2017. Formal documentation is mandated and you must present your child's school with a completed Florida Certificate of Immunization form DH680 with an updated Part A signed by your child's healthcare provider before he/she can receive a schedule or enter school on the first day of classes.

Please submit the blue or white DH680 immunization form with Part A or B completed to your child's school as soon as possible. Your child's healthcare provider or the Seminole County Health Department can provide the Tdap booster.

Seminole County policy does not grant a 30-day extension to obtain required immunizations or a physical. Immunizations and physicals may be obtained through the student's physician. Only students who do not have health insurance coverage or children who are assigned to the Department of Health in Seminole County as their health care provider may obtain immunizations through Florida Department of Health in Seminole County.

If you can't see your child's private provider, your child's Immunizations and the DH 680 form can be obtained at the Florida Department of Health in Seminole County, no appointment needed. Hours are: Mon. – Fri., 8:00 am - 3:00 pm (except for the 2nd Thurs. of each month, only open 8:00 - 11:30 am). For more information call 407-665-3281.

Summer Reading

Select and read TWO books, that you have not read, by authors on the provided list, or novels on the current middle school Sunshine State Young Reader's Award (SSYRA) list (available at libraries, bookstores, and at <u>http://www.floridamedia.org/?page=ssyrahome</u>). **Please Note: Students going into 7th and 8th Grade ADVANCED** or GIFTED level classes should choose at least one of their two authors from the challenging list.

Additional information, including copies of the worksheets, authors by genre, and book suggestions will be available on Sanford Middle's website: http://www.sanford.scps.k12.fl.us/. After going to the website, go to the "Students" tab at the top, then move down to "Students S-Z", then click on "Summer Reading."

The books can be fiction or nonfiction. You will complete the **Outside Reading Report** for **both** books (available to download on the school website). Choose **ONE** of your books to complete the additional assignment of creating a bookmark.

For the Bookmark Assignment:

If your book was **fiction**:

Use the information on your **Outside Reading Report for Fiction** to create a bookmark about your book. Your bookmark should include:

- The title and author of the book.
- Summary of important events (the events that occur in the book) without giving away the ending.
- Characters list the main characters, their defining traits and conflicts they face.
- Setting Describe the setting of your book.
- Theme What was the theme of your book?
- Review How did the story make your feel? Did you enjoy it? Explain what you did/did not enjoy. Be specific with details about the plot, characters, setting and language of the book.
- Graphics Include a picture or image from the book that relates to the theme. The image can be clip art, hand- drawn art, or an image cut from a magazine.

If your book was **nonfiction**:

Use the information on your **Outside Reading Report for Nonfiction** to create a bookmark about your book. Your bookmark should include:

- The title and author of the book.
- Know What did you know about the topic before you started reading?
- Want What did you want to learn about the topic and why?
- Learn What are three new things you learned from this book?
- Connections Make three connections to the book.
- Review Did you enjoy the book? Explain why you did not did not enjoy it. Be specific with details!
- Graphics Include a picture or image from the book that relates to the topic. The image can be clip art, hand- drawn art, or an image cut from a magazine.

Your bookmark can either be neatly handwritten <u>or</u> typed. A sample bookmark for *The Hobbit* by J.R.R. Tolkien is attached as an example.

You will turn in **two Outside Reading Reports (1 for each book), and one bookmark**. Be sure your name is on everything. Be prepared to share about both of your books that you read in your Language Arts class in August. The assignment is **required**, is due the **second Friday** we return from Summer Break, and will count as a **homework assignment** in your Language Arts class.



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Personal Electronic Device Use Policy

In support of our school's Mission and Vision, and our efforts to provide a meaningful exchange of ideas, Sanford Middle School permits students to use their personal electronic devices before and after school, and during lunch. It applies to but is not limited to all electronic devices and accessories such as: tablet PCs, wireless tablets, iPods, MP3 players, camera phones, digital cameras, laptops, earphones, ear buds, or bluetooth ear pieces.

Personal electronic devices should be used in manners, which promote learning and growth. These devices, however, must remain out of sight, turned off, or on silent during the instructional day, and during class unless the teacher authorizes device usage for a class-related purpose. If a teacher gives permission for the use of a personal device for classroom communication, research, note-taking, or recording that is the sole purpose to which these devices should be put.Students found violating the Acceptable Use and the Sanford Middle School Personal Electronic Device Use Policies will lose their electronic equipment privileges. Students may use their electronic devices:

- Before the 9:25 a.m. bell. Once the bell has rung all equipment must be immediately put away before entering any building on campus.
- During lunch, in the cafeteria, and in the designated patio areas. Electronic devices must be put away before the leaving the patio areas.
- At dismissal after they have exited the building.

• With teacher direction for instructional purposes.

- Students may not use their electronic devices:
- Between classes.
- During water and restroom breaks while classes are in session.
- With sound amplifying portable speakers.

Please note Sanford Middle does not require personal electronic devices to be brought on campus by students for instructional purposes. When on campus, a student's personal electronic device is the sole responsibility of the student. We will not be held responsible or liable for damage, loss, or theft of a personal electronic device. We, therefore, encourage parents/ guardians to discuss with their students whether or not they permit electronic devices to be brought to school. Should a parent/ guardian elect for their child to bring any electronic device to school, we kindly request for this parent/guardian to specifically outline the rules for which their child may bring and use such electronic device.

Attendance

Regular attendance provides students the opportunity to participate in many integral learning activities, such as class discussions, group experiences, field trips, guest speakers, and direct instruction, which cannot be simulated or replicated with written work. Therefore, with the goal of promoting student achievement and increasing the likelihood of success the Seminole County Public Schools has adopted a uniform Middle School Attendance Policy. Students are required to:

- Come to school regularly during the entire school year.
- If school should have to be missed due to an excused absence as defined in the Florida State Statutes and/or Seminole County Public Schools Attendance Policy; parents/ guardians are required to provide written documentation for the student's absence.
- A student accumulating ten (10) unexcused absences in ninety (90) calendar days may be referred to the school social worker and recommended for processing as a truant. Upon each subsequent unexcused absence, the parent/guardian shall be notified of the student's nonattendance. The parent/guardian will also be informed of the truancy procedures that will be followed if the student persists in being unexcused from school

Seminole County Public Schools

Student Appearance and Dress Code

Responsibility for the dress and appearance of students enrolled in the Seminole County Public Schools primarily rests with parents and the students. Some student apparel, however, may not be appropriate to wear to school even though that same apparel may be appropriate to wear in other settings. To assist parents and students in making appropriate fashion and grooming decisions for school, the School Board has established the following minimal guidelines for the appearance and dress of students.

The standards of appearance for students shall insure that the students be clean, neat, and properly dressed. They shall observe modes of dress and standards of personal grooming which are appropriate for the academic environment. It is the responsibility of the principal to see that the dress appearance of any student shall not be extreme, to the point of creating a disturbance, or is hazardous to self, others, or school property, whether or not the specific case is covered by the information below. The principal or principal's designee has the final authority for interpreting whether a student's apparel/appearance conforms to the dress code.

All schools have the option of adopting a standard dress code (uniform) when developed and agreed upon in collaboration with their School Advisory Council. Schools that adopt a standard dress code policy should include the following: Collared shirts, sleeves, khaki or dark pants/shorts/skorts, defined shirt colors (e.g. school colors).

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No hats, caps, visors, hoods, sunglasses or other head gear may be worn on campus except with administrative permission (i.e. medical necessity, religious practice, school related events)

	 (a) Garments must be of a length and fit that are suitable to the build and stature of the student. (b) All garments must have a collar or sleeves. Therefore, the following items are prohibited: halter tops, tube tops, backless dresses/tops, spaghetti straps, and tank tops. 	 (c) Necklines of all upper garments must be modest. Low cut necklines are prohibited, and the cut of garments must not expose undergarments or cleavage. (d) Shirts must touch, at a minimum, the top portion of lower garments at all times. (e) Garments that are distracting or inappropriate are prohibited, including but not limited to those with see -through materials, skintight items, pajamas, trench coats, bandanas, rips/tears, printed profanity, or language/symbols/styles that promote the use of alcohol, drugs, tobacco products, gang-related or other illegal activities 		
	(3) LOWER GARMENTS			
(a) Pants and shorts should conform to the build and stature of the student. Students are banned from wearing baggy and/or sagging pants (See consequences below).(b) Undergarments and the buttocks MUST remain entirely covered even while seated.		 (c) Dresses, skirts and shorts must be at least mid-thigh or below in length. Rip/tears above mid-thigh that expose skin or undergarments are not permitted. (d) The waistband of pants, shorts or skirts must be worn and secured between the hips and the waist. (e) Undergarments as outerwear, pajama pants, bathing suits, cheer shorts, bike shorts and bottoms made of spandex material are prohibited. 		

NOTE: Consequences for wearing baggy and/or sagging pants:

1. For the first offense, a student shall be given a verbal warning and the school principal/designee shall call the student's parent or guardian.

- 2. For the second offense, the student is ineligible to participate in any extracurricular activity for a period of time not to exceed five (5) days and the school principal/designee shall meet with the student's parent or guardian.
- 3. For a third or subsequent offense, a student shall receive an in-school suspension pursuant to s.1003.014 (5) for a period not to exceed three (3) days, the student is ineligible to participate in any extracurricular activity for a period not to exceed 30 days and the principal/designee shall call the student's parent or guardian and send the parent or guardian a written letter regarding the student's in-school suspension and ineligibility to participate in extracurricular activities will be subjected to the consequences listed in the Matrix of Infractions.

Dress Code Protocol

Sanford Middle is committed to providing the best possible education for your children. In order to continue with this goal, it is imperative to have a dress code that promotes a non-distracting, non-violent, and non-harmful atmosphere on campus. If there are any questions regarding the dress code policy, please refer to your children's student planners. If a student violates the dress code, the consequence listed would apply.

- 1st Offense: Warning Letter & Phone Call
- 2nd Offense: Wednesday School, & Phone Call
- 3rd Offense: Referral, Wednesday School, & Phone Call
- Any violation after this will be looked at as insubordination and will result in In-School or Out-of-School suspension

Skyward- Family Access

Family Access by Skyward, Inc. is a secure Internet based website that will allow you to easily keep track of your child's information. Family Access is a free service available to all parents with children enrolled in the district. It displays attendance, assignments and grades to a parent via a web application.

You will need to register for a login and password if you do not already have access. By signing and returning the following form, you are authorizing the Seminole County Public Schools to provide you with your unique login and password. You must present the following form in person at our school. At that time you will be asked to show a photo ID. If you have children in multiple Seminole County Schools, you only need to register at one school. Your Family Access login will be active for as long as you have children in the Seminole County Public Schools.
