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A Message from the Principal

Happy New Year Warhawk Families!

As I begin this message, we are in the middle of the most successful Quarter 3 ever for the Warhawk Nation! The Center for Education and Leadership (CEL) juniors, along with Teacher of the Year Deanna Russo and Coach of the Year Shannan Tyson, are leading the Health Information (HIP) project, a national, student-led program to ensure the physical and mental health of rising high schoolers, and our Freshmen class members. Through our Academic Resource, Social and Emotional Learning Advisory Period (AR), students are receiving extra academic supports with grade level Seminars from our School Guidance Counselors, led by Leslie Morrow,



push-in interventions, such as ACT & SAT boot camps, and PERT assessment strategy sessions. SHS is a "Golden School Award" winner in leadership and school volunteerism, as designated by the Department of Education. Seminole High School is a 5 Star National Blue Ribbon Award Winning School, also recognized by the Florida Department of Education for our overall academic excellence, and progress in closing achievement gaps! SHS is recognized by the Florida Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports Project as a Bronze Medal Award Winner for being a PBIS Model School which exemplifies our continued commitment to positive outcomes for ALL students! The Warhawk Nation is a National PTA School of Excellence! Our boys' basketball team clinched the PCAC runner-up prize, led by "Mr. Warhawk" himself, our Athletic Director & Head Basketball Coach, Josh Walker. Each one of our Visual and Performing Arts groups under the direction of Gerard Madrinan and Lauren Cattell, continue to excel in every genre' - vocal, instrumental, orchestral, visual, and performance. Seminole High School's Visual Arts Department, with resident teacher-artists Blaine Barden and Todd Leisek is partnering with St. Petersburg Glass Project to be the only high school glass studio in Pinellas County Schools. Art Students have placed in the Word and Image, Surreal, New Perspectives, and Scholastic Art and Writing Shows with 15 honorable mentions; 2 silver keys; and 1 gold key award. Phenomenal SHS student art work is displayed throughout Seminole High School, and in the Pinellas County Schools Administration Building! Our Jazz Band, led by Steve Harris, performs weekly in the Warhawk Courtyard with a rousing "Weekend Sendoff" for students and faculty. Chorus, jazz band, and the orchestra performed at the Seminole City Center for the Holiday Celebration Tree Lighting Ceremony in December. We have 8 all county orchestra players; 8 all county band players, including 2 principal, "first chair" musicians who performed in the Pinellas County All County Music Festivals in January. The SHS Orchestra, which has the legendary distinction of having performed at Carnegie Hall, is hosting the Florida Orchestra Association District Music Performance Assessment this February. Each of our Jazz Bands were selected by Clearwater Jazz Holiday Foundation to perform in the Young Lions Jazz Master Sessions. And our Warhawk Marching Band is the Grand Champion of the Pinellas Park Holiday Parade competition; a Top 12 State Finalist at the Bands of America Orlando Super Regional; and a Finalist for the Florida Marching Band State Championships. Our incredible 4A Performing & Visual Arts Academy Leader, as well as SHS Warhawk Marching Band Director, Mr. Gerard Madrinan is the Pinellas County Music Education Association's Secondary Music Teacher of the Year award winner!

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Seminole High School is 1 of only 8 schools in the nation that has been designated as a Model School of Excellence, by the International Conference for Leadership and Education. This honor is due to Seminole High's mission and success in getting students connected, while achieving, and sustaining academic, social, and emotional growth. Our 7 Academies, as well as the vibrant, schoolwide AVID program, along with the emerging preeminence of our new STEAM academy, and the 60 + clubs on campus; continue to ensure that students are provided with a community of care, motivation to find their passion, and a place to belong. Highlights of these programs range from Media Technology's SHS Morning Show, run by Matt Merryman, which broadcasts to our entire student body, to the E-Commerce Academy, under the direction of Bill Scales, which is an Academy of Distinction. The creation and implementation of, our innovative online school store, "The Warhawk Shop," continues to streamline virtually all financial services at our school. It's no wonder this academy is the recipient of the "Florida Association for Career and Technical Education's INNOVATION AWARD!" Seminole High School's Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math, or "STEAM" Academy, is proud to have a member who is a Sunshine State STEM Scholar Award recipient. SHS STEAM will be a part of the FWEA/AWWA Florida Water Sustainability Festival at the St. Petersburg Pier this March and will host the AWWA Model Water Tower competition this year at SHS for all Hillsborough and Pinellas County Middle and High Schools! Our STEAM program has already been awarded over \$35,000.00 in grants for technology to support student engagement and innovation. SHS Steam's Drone Program has successfully launched, and students are incorporating this technology with remotely operated, student-built submarines to determine water quality! The water quality data will be analyzed using ArcGIS to illustrate temporal and spatial differences. Wow! Working in tandem with our STEAM program is Pinellas County Utilities' South Cross Bayou Education Program, who won the Secondary Business Partner of the Year Award for Pinellas County Schools because of their work with SHS! The Center for Educational Leadership, known as our CEL Academy, has 100% of their seniors successfully participating in internships at 4 local elementary schools, as well as Seminole Middle School, and in SHS's ESE classrooms. CEL academy student leaders created the new on-campus organization "Educators Rising," which spotlights amazing teachers on our campus. Other CEL members are working in tandem with our "Live Free" substance abuse educative program as well. Over the past 3 years our CEL students have earned nearly 3.5 MILLION dollars in college and university scholarships!!!! In the literary and scholastic realm, our Hawk Talk Magazine is the American Scholastic Press Association's 1st Place Winner and our Warhawk Yearbook is a National Sample for the 4th year in a row! Academically at Seminole High School, we have over 12 National and International Honor Societies! Seminole High School continues to demonstrate strong academic growth while promoting more rigorous course work, with innovative support systems for ALL learners. I am so grateful for Briana Hodavance and Matt Gluchowski's leadership while serving on the Superintendent and Pinellas County School Board's Rights and Responsibility Committee. This year we are proud to announce our National Merit Letter of Commendation Award Winner, Megan Arbuckle! 2022-2023 Scheduling Updates

Student course selections are coming up soon! Students should use the next few weeks to have conversations with their teachers and decide what courses they will take next year. Students should be advised the course selection sheets that were distributed in AR are for planning purposes. Actual <u>course selections will be completed using an electronic form with the counselors during grade level seminars</u>. Please see the seminar schedule below:

Juniors will meet with counselors the week of February 7th via their US History classes.

Sophomores will meet with counselors the week of February 14th via World History classes.

Freshmen will meet with counselors the week of February 21st via their English classes.

The counseling team will finish completing course requests by the end of February. If your child was absent when these meetings occurred, the information will be emailed to their <u>R2.D2@pcsb.org</u> email which they can access in Clever. **All students and parents are encouraged to review their course requests by going to the course request tab in FOCUS.** Students will however be able to adjust their requests with their counselors through March 10th. To submit a course request change students must scan the QR code (or click the image) and complete the form below before the deadline.

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Center for Educational Leadership

In CEL 1 students are currently learning about goal setting and soon will be practicing job interviewing skills this month. We will also be covering topics such as diversity and accountability systems in the classroom/workplace. CEL 2 is studying the stages of human development by completing a creative project where the different stages are represented by student-created rides at a theme park. CEL 3 is currently practicing presentation skills by sharing their current research with different classrooms around campus.



CEL Senior Marija Mitevska describes the CEL Internship experience: For the fourth year in CEL, you are tasked with an internship at an elementary school. Depending on your strengths, you are paired with a teacher who could use your help with the students. The internship can be with any grade level and any content area. For the internship, you spend the CEL class period going to the school. Then you help students learn, either by working one on one with them or by helping them understand their assignments. You are helping the students learn and grow, furthering their education. When they succeed, you feel as if you have achieved something great as well!

CEL Senior Josh Wager explains the HIP Program: HIP stands for the Health Information Project. Seminole High School was chosen to be one of the first Pinellas County Schools to pilot this program. In HIP, SHS juniors are trained through this nationally recognized program to teach SHS ninth graders about health-related issues that they may be dealing with and how to receive help. This program is allowing our CEL juniors to have real-world experiences delivering lessons. While, learning necessary life skills the juniors are also obtaining volunteer hours.
