







MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL SPARGER

I hope this letter finds you **healthy and happy and enjoying the New Year**. As strange as it may sound, we are already thinking about next school year. Over the next several weeks, students will meet with their guidance counselor to begin the process of **selecting classes for next school year**. These meetings will take place during the school day in the months of **February and March**. Please reach out to your student's high school guidance counselor with questions on the registration process. For our seniors, they will begin to finalize their plans for life after high school. All seniors are encouraged to stay current with **graduation dates** and **deadlines** and to look for the next edition of the senior letter. We anxiously await celebrating with the **Class of 2020** at their graduation ceremony on **Saturday, May 30 at 8:30 am**.

All students in grades 9 and 10 will take the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) / English Language Arts (ELA) exam during the second semester. The FSA replaced the FCAT as the test required to graduate from high school. The FSA Writing will be administered on April 1 and 2 followed by the FSA Reading from May 4 – 8. The required End of Course (EOC) tests for students currently enrolled in Algebra, Biology, Geometry, and United States History will take place the week of May 11. More information regarding these FSA assessments and sample questions visit https://fsassessments.org/. For students enrolled in AP and IB classes, those exams will be administered during the month of May.

As a result of the collective efforts or our students, faculty and community, the Hawks continue to soar. The State of Florida has recognized Spruce Creek High School as a **"School of Excellence."** We are the only high school in Volusia County to earn this recognition. Our **graduation rate rose to nearly 94%** and over **1,800** of our students earned honor roll status for the first semester. Nearly 250 students earned straight **"A" grades** for the first semester and approximately 40 of our **fall** and **winter sport** student-athletes placed on the all-area team for their sport. Multiple **conference**, **district**, and **regional championships** were also won by both teams and individuals. *It's truly a great time to be a Hawk!*

We want to give a big thank you to the **District's Facilities Department** for their efforts with upgrades to the guard house, exterior fencing, and main office. These changes will enhance our current security measures already in place. Thank you to our Hawk family for complying with the procedures which are designed to keep all on our campus safe. *Please note that once the school day begins, all must use the main office to enter and exit the campus.*

Happy New Year Hawks!

We hope everyone enjoyed their holiday break and returned to the Nest ready to soar through the final semester. Seniors going to college that have not already completed the FAFSA for federal financial aid online at www.fafsa.ed.gov need to do so immediately. Also, Seniors, if you did not register for the Bright Futures Scholarship, which is state financial aid, please see your Counselor right away for information on how to apply. Check our school website, www.sprucecreekhigh.com, for an updated list of available scholarships.

Juniors and Seniors that have taken Algebra 2 or higher should register for the SAT and/or ACT for college acceptance and to meet testing requirements for a Bright Futures Scholarship. If you qualify for free/reduced student lunch, see your Counselor for a fee waiver. The SAT and ACT can also be used to earn concordant scores to meet high school graduation requirements if you have not already passed the FSA ELA and/ or Algebra 1 EOC.

The ASVAB Career Exploration Test helps identify your skills and interests and encourages you to explore all the pathways you can take to reach your career goals. It also serves as test prep for the SAT and ACT. There is no cost to take this exam. See your Counselor now to sign up for the next ASVAB test, which will be offered March 27, 2020 from 8:30-11:30 in the Media Center.

Please listen to daily announcements and visit our school website often. You can email Mrs. Rocco (rrrocco@volusia.k12.fl.us) and ask for her to add your email address to the daily announcements distribution list so you don't miss news. The announcements will be delivered to your inbox daily!

Registration for next school year is scheduled to begin the end of February. The Counselors are looking forward to meeting individually with students to review recommendations and elective choices and to request courses for next school year. Remember foreign language is NOT a graduation requirement, but it IS required for university admission and for Bright Future Scholarships. If you need to remediate any courses you did not pass, talk to your Counselor about summer opportunities to get caught up with your credits!

Registration for summer dual enrollment at DSC begins April 6th. The PERT test will be offered on our campus February 10 – 13, 2020. If you are interested in starting dual enrollment, please see your Counselor before/after school or during office hours/lunch for more information.

Students may see their Counselor without an appointment before and after school or during office hours/student lunch. For all other needs, students

should fill out a "Request to See Counselor" form. Counselors can also be reached via email by going to the counseling department website at www.sprucecreekcounseling.weebly.com. From July 1st – July 12th, we will travel to Brussels, The Hague and Amsterdam to explore innovative solutions for Creating a Sustainable Future and the power each of us has to create long-term change through our daily actions. On July 9th, 2021, your student will join educators and students from around the world for a three-day leadership conference in Berlin, Germany. They will hear from world-renowned speakers, like Jane Goodall, Al Gore, and Sir Ken Robinson, attend expert-led workshops from organizations such as Google and UNICEF, and work in small international teams to develop and prototype innovative solutions to a global challenge. The conference will culminate with students pitching their ideas to earn a spot in the Nobel Prize Museum in Stockholm, Sweden.

Students who participate will expand their leadership skills, connect to their studies outside of the classroom and take part in an experience that will set them apart when applying to college and their future careers.

Throughout the second quarter of the 2019-2020 school year, service club Give to Live, headed by Alice Le Roux, was responsible for the organization and execution of several local events for community benefit. Beginning in late November, the club began collecting toys for children in need, with intentions to put together two drives to give everything away to underprivileged children in the community around Christmas. The toys were gathered with the help of all the members, and stored at club president Alice Le Roux's house, where Give to Live members gathered on some weekends to sort and clean the toys. The efforts were noticed by a local newspaper, and the club was featured in the Ormond Beach Observer on December 7th. The article focused on the environmentally-conscious nature of the club and advertised the drives, author Wayne Grant stating "[t]here will be more than 1,200 toys and games for children of all ages given away at the event" in reference to the Hope Place giveaway. It included a photo of some members with the toys and a club banner. The first drive was held on December 14th

at Hope Place, a local homeless center, and took place on the morning of December 21st.
