#### **ATTENDANCE MATTERS**

Student attendance is an important factor in academic success. Did you know that by 6th grade absenteeism is one of the three signs that a student will not graduate from high school? It is estimated that chronic absences have more than doubled in the last five years. Students missing more than ten percent of school days for any reason are considered to be chronically absent. This includes both excused and unexcused absences. Examples of excused absences include illness, medical appointments, or the death of an immediate family member. Missing school for oversleeping, vacation or extensive illness without medical documentation are considered to be unexcused. Although students are able to make up work that they may miss while they are out, they are still missing valuable instruction, class discussions, and learning opportunities when they aren't physically in school. Typically, students have one day for everyday missed plus an additional day to complete makeup work without penalty.

Seminole County in accordance with Florida Statute 1003.26 does track student attendance and if needed can refer students to truancy court for chronic absenteeism. Truancy is an established pattern of nonattendance. We understand that at times it may be necessary for your student to be out. In the event that they have to miss school please send in any official documentation or a handwritten note so their attendance can be coded appropriately. Notes can be turned in to your child's first period teacher or submitted to the front office.

If your child has to be out for any reason, we suggest having your student check their eCampus pages as well as following up with their teachers to ensure that they don't fall behind. If your student is able to work from home, this can ease the feelings of being overwhelmed when they return to school. Often middle schoolers have to be reminded that when they are out of school learning is still happening and they are still held responsible for assignments, tests, and quizzes that may take place when they are out. As a parent/guardian you can also monitor your student's attendance and grades through Skyward.

#### **6TH GRADE SCIENCE**

Happy New Year from the 6th grade Science team and welcome to the second semester! 6th grade students will now study the following units:

**4- Earth's Interior, 5- Interaction of Spheres, 6- Beyond our World, and 7- Physics** for the second semester. Upcoming labs include a candy bar geology lab, plate tectonics, gravity exploration activities, and two weeks of hands-on physics lab experiences.

Parents and guardians, please be sure your child has a pencil and their interactive science notebook daily. The pencil supply is running low and we may run out soon. Please ensure that your student is studying their unit vocabulary every night for at least 5 minutes. The continuous practice will help prepare them for their weekly vocab quizzes, unit assessments, and the last Quarterly Benchmark Assessment. 


