PLEASE DO USE THE CAR LINE IN THE REAR OF THE SCHOOL FOR PICK UP. TRAFFIC CONGESTION IS PRETTY SERIOUS IN THE FRONT OF THE SCHOOL, AND THERE IS LIMITED PARKING. We have worked with the Sheriff's office for viable alternatives to our traffic issues, but there does not seem to be a viable solution, except extraordinary care and patience.

Cell phones ARE NOT TO be used in classrooms unless it is with EXPLICIT TEACHER PERMISSION AND FOR INSTRUCTIONAL PURPOSES ONLY. Students who need to make a call home can utilize school phones to do so with teacher's permission.

8TH GRADE U.S. HISTORY

We will have brand new textbooks this year so please take care of them. Students will also be issued a Workbook, which normally stays in class, because students usually tear the pages out as the teachers assign them. Please note: Students can find the textbook online in the "CLEVER" Portal system under CLASS TOOLS—SOCIAL STUDIES. Students, please click on the "TCI" tile to access the online textbook because TCI is the name of the textbook publisher.

During the first nine weeks grading period, the 8th grade U.S. History teachers will be teaching the following content: Studying History Through Inquiry, Key Themes in History, Indigenous Peoples of North America, European Colonization in the Americas, Comparing the English Colonies, and Life in the Colonies.

During the second nine weeks grading period, we will be covering Toward Independence, The Declaration of Independence, The American Revolution, Creating the Constitution, The Constitution, and The Bill of Rights.

Common Assessments will be administered at the end of each nine-week grading period. Students must study for them using the study guides that will be provided to each of them whenever possible.

Students in U.S. History classes will be using the following strategies to increase their achievement in reading and writing: analyzing primary and secondary sources in history and using

textual evidence to support an argument. Other instructional strategies that we will be utilizing with the students include the PEEL writing strategy along with the Paraphrasing writing strategy to increase student achievement.

Thank you for always helping your child to be prepared with the proper supplies for each class. Basic supplies that students should bring to class include a pen or pencil, paper, and a folder.

In PRE-AP U.S. History classes, students are required to complete a "National History Day" project (also known as "NHD"). This year's 2023-2024 NHD theme has not been released yet. Students and parents, please refer to the NHD website to find out the rules, categories, and expectations for the NHD projects: www.nhd.org (specific instructions will be provided in Pre-AP U.S. History classes for the NHD projects). The NHD projects are usually due at the end of January 2024/ beginning of February 2024. Most of this NHD project is to be completed by students at home.

As summer wraps up and the 2023-2024 school year is ready to begin, we would like to welcome your child to 6th grade science! This is going to be an exciting year!



Teague Middle School provides a Sports Program that provides a safe and organized environment for friendly competition against other middle schools in the county. Students will have fun, develop skills, learn the game, learn teamwork and practice good sportsmanship. The program offers four sports. Volleyball, Cross Country, Track and Field, and Basketball.

- Students will be required to try-out for Volleyball and Basketball (tryout dates TBD and will be posted on the Teague website, social media pages, as well as announced to students on TNN).
- All students **trying out** must provide a Consent and Release form signed by the parent.
- If your child is chosen on a team, one parent/guardian must attend an informational meeting (date to TBD by coach) and the student must have a current school sports physical.
 - Each sport will have a fee of \$50 (to offset the cost of buses, coaching and officials).
 - Parents are encouraged to come to all games and meets (volleyball and basketball games require a small door charge to cover gym costs).
 - Practices days are determined by the coach but are usually in the afternoons after school.
 - Games and meets are played on campus or at one of the middle schools in Seminole County.
 - Transportation to away games/meets is provided by SCPS.
 - All Parent Consent and Sports Physical Forms can be found on the Teague website.
 - Prospective student-athletes must have ALL physical and clearance paperwork updated annually and turned in to Teague Middle School.
 Only those student-athletes cleared by the school will be released and eligible for participation in athletic events


