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### Guidance News

### September 2024

The school year is off to a great start. Students are beginning to apply to college, prepare for the ACT/SAT tests, join clubs, write resumes, attend sporting events, attend after school events and get in the rhythm of homework. Many students have been meeting with their counselor for assistance with post-secondary planning. Students have also been meeting with their counselor to discuss their VHS 4-year plan.

### \*Reminder to Dual Enrollment/SCF students:\*

If you change your original SCF schedule, please let your counselor know asap. You will need to provide a copy of your detailed schedule to your counselor and you will also need to submit an official transcript of your final SCF grades to your counselor. PSAT date - October 21-25 (TBD)

PSAT is for all 10th graders and any 11th grader that is competing for the National Merit Scholarship.

11th graders must pay to take the test. Please see Mr. Robertson (4-314) to register for the test. He can only accept checks and they should be made payable to VHS.

FSA-ELA and Algebra 1 EOC retakes for 11th and 12th graders will begin in September.

Students are reminded to please check their transcripts to make sure they have all the classes needed to qualify for the Bright Futures scholarship.

\*\*Seniors will be visiting with their counselors to ensure they have all credits needed for graduation. <u>Double check your transcript to make sure you have all credits necessary for graduation!</u> Please remember the Class of 2025 graduation requirements are:

- English-4 credits
- Math-4 credits (1 must be Algebra 1 and 1 must be Geometry) Science-3 credits (1 must be Biology)
- World History-1 credit American History-1 credit Economics-.5 credit
- American Government-.5 credit HOPE-1 credit Practical/Performing Art-1 credit Electives
- 26 credits total
  - » Passing Score on FSA ELA
  - » Passing score on Algebra 1 EOC
  - » 2.0 GPA

Students who are requesting testing accommodations on the SAT or ACT for college purposes will need to see their guidance counselor for the appropriate forms.

#### **Student Athletes**

You will need to register with NCAA clearinghouse and then speak with your counselor to send your transcripts. Please be aware of the 16 core credits needed for eligibility (there has been a change with the math courses that qualify). Please refer to the NCAA website or meet with your counselor if you have any questions. Also, remember on August 1, 2016 NCAA eligibility requirements changed. Please visit the NCAA Eligibility website for details.

If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact your counselor. The students are paired with a counselor based on the student's last name.

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The Sarasota County School District has established procedural guidelines for student dress, inaccordance with School oard Policy 5.37.

Individual schools are expected to use the District dress code guidelines as minimum standards and are encouraged to extend their own standards to meet the uniqueness of their school community. Schools are encouraged to obtain input from school stakeholders, including School Advisory Councils, parents, staff, and students as they establish a school dress code policy.

#### The principal's decision on the appropriateness of dress will be final. Refusal to comply with theschool's dress code policy is an infraction under this code.


Students have a RIGHT to:

- · Wear appropriate clothes or the school uniform, as long as those clothes or the way the clothes are worn are appropriate for the school setting, adhere to the school dress code, arenot dangerous to health or
- safety, and do not disrupt the learning environment. Learn without a disruption to the school or classroom environment.

Students have a RESPONSIBILITY to: Comply

- with the school dress code.
- Wear their current/valid student ID (visible at all times).
- Be respectful of their peers at all times regardless of what they are wearing.
- Come to school fully clothed and wear clothes which are not dangerous to health or safety do not disrupt the learning process, and stay within the school dress code.
- · Dress in a way not offensive to others at school or at school-sponsored events, including, butnot limited to: · At all times, no:
- exposed undergarments
  - jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants worn below the hips
  - · jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants with rips above the mid-thigh
  - excessively short skirts, shorts, or dresses that at any time expose underwear or bodyparts in an indecent or vulgar mann
  - pajamas or slippers
  - excessively low-cut tops
  - see-through clothing (includes mesh material mid-thigh and above)clothing of an
- ethnic or racially offensive nature
- · Clothing must cover the mid-riff when standing naturally
- · Sleeveless shirts must have straps with a minimum width of one inch (about two fingers) and the gap below the armpit cannot be excessive of three inches (about four fingers)
- · Not wear items or markings which are offensive, suggestive, indecent, or associated withgangs; as identified by the Florida Gang Intent Act of 1990.
- · Not wear items which encourage the use of drugs, tobacco, alcohol, violence, weapons, or support discrimination on account of race, color, religion, ethnic or national origin, age, disability, veteran or military status, marital status, pregnancy, sex, gender, gender identity orexpression, sexual orientation, or any other characteristic protected by federal or state law orSchool Board policy.

# Bright Futures Scholarship Requirements for the Class of 2025

Seniors MUST complete the Florida Financial Aid Application (not to be confused with the FAFSA) to receive Bright Futures.

- Only Seniors may complete the application, and we encourage Seniors to do so ASAP after October 1, 2024. The application must be completed so the Senior is in the system to be evaluated.
- The first evaluation is done in January, and the FINAL evaluation for the scholarship is done in July 2024 after high school graduation. Students have until graduation to meet all requirements.
- Seniors may take the SAT or ACT through July of their Senior year to qualify for Bright Futures.
- To complete the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) (Seniors Only) go to: <u>https://www.floridastudentfinancialaidsg.org</u> Under First-Time Applicants, click on Create Student Account AFTER OCTOBER 1 (The application doesn't open until then). This is only step 1 of the process.

After submitting the student account, you must click on a link to finish completing the Florida Financial Aid Application. After submitting the student account, the student will receive an email with their log in and initial password. After submitting the Florida Financial Aid Application, the student will receive an email in 2-3 days with instructions for logging in and tracking their evaluations.

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



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### Guardian: How to Create an Account and

Claim a Student




#### Students must "invite" their guardian to create an account in SchooLinks

To create a guardian account (or to claim additional students), you must have a claim code. Your student will need to provide you with their unique claim code (instructions below) for you to create and link your account.

#### Inviting your guardian to create an account in SchooLinks:

When logged into your student account (MySCS SchooLinks tile), click the **Gear icon** in the top right-hand corner, then click **Account Settings**.

From here you will see and click on the section called Your Guardians pictured below:




Click on the **View Guardian Instructions and Unique Claim Code**, this will show a window like the one below, with instructions to send to your guardian. Copy the information and share it with the guardian who you're trying to add to SchooLinks. See the example below:



Your guardian simply needs to enter the link into their browser and they'll be taken to a page where they can claim you as their student.

As an alternative option, at the end of the link, there's a code. Your guardian could go to app.schoolinks.com/claim-student and follow the onscreen steps to enter the code there.



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
