We have Sherriff's Resource Deputies (SRD's) who are always on campus and highly trained as well as security persons who patrol all areas of our main campus and FLC all throughout each school day. We check incoming and outgoing vehicles within our student parking lot using our security person stationed at our security booth located in front of the performing arts center and all visitor's credentials are checked through our electronic Raptor System. We have a secure perimeter on both campuses. Students now have district issued ID badges that they are expected to always have with them. Students must also have a permission pass when leaving class or campus during the school day. We have significant security camera coverage across both campuses, and I thank our school district for its investments made to secure our campuses. We know that working together, we will continue to make our school a safer place.

I am very proud our students and all their efforts in school as well as in their extracurriculars. Be sure to see our athletics page inside this newsletter for the host of accolades our sports teams and performing arts programs have garnered this past fall season. Our performing arts department is entering the height of their competitive season and already brining home superior accolades! If your student is not yet involved with at least one extracurricular activity, then please encourage them to join a club, sport, or performing art. Performing Arts Department Happenings

The VBHS Performing Arts Department has had a busy second nine weeks. On October 16th, the VBHS Band hosted the 40th Annual Treasure Coast Crown Jewel Marching Festival. There were 12 high school bands from around the state who performed their halftime shows in the competition. On Saturday, October 23rd the Fighting Indians Band participated in the Florida Bandmasters Association District 13 Marching Music Performance Assessment at Jensen Beach HS. The band earned straight superior ratings. Two of our band students, Ludin Aquino and Lataydrick Willis, were nominated and selected for the Florida High School Honor Band. They will be traveling to Tampa in January to perform with this concert band comprised of students from around Florida.

The VBHS Choir has been working hard on sight singing and preparing literature for MPA. They spread cheer through Vero with their annual poinsettia fundraiser and several community caroling performances. In addition, in the spirit of community togetherness, the Choir invited staff and community choir men to sing with our men's choir at the Performing Arts Department's winter concert "Scenes from a Snow Globe".

Faith Bebber, Greyson Wong, and Anthony Celano all auditioned for All State and made it to the final round of competition. Anthony Celano was selected as a member of the TTBB choir and will be attending All State in Tampa in January.

90% Attendance, Tardy Policies, and Procedures

VBHS has a 90% Attendance Policy, which means students must attend 90% of their classes in order to participate in sports, extracurricular activities, clubs and/or privileges (parking, dances, Grad Bash, Prom, etc.). Students may participate in practices, rehearsals, etc. but may not participate, compete, or perform in athletic games, performances, and extracurricular events until they are in compliance with the 90% Attendance Policy.

Please note that for a tardy to be excused, a parent/guardian must physically sign the student in at the attendance desk or the student needs to provide a medical or court note for the time missed. NO phone calls to excuse a tardy. If a student has been called out of class by attendance to be able to leave campus, the student must sign out at the attendance desk and receive a pass to leave campus for the absence to be excused. To have a student called to leave campus, you must be on the contact list in Focus. There is also no early release for students after 1:25pm.
