## From Principal Matthew Arnold

Dear Wildcats,

Thank you for your support of Winter Park High School! As we continually strive to be the top producer of successful students in the nation, I would like to share some accomplishments from this past school year. A high performing school like WPHS does not exist without a dedicated staff, ambitious and inquisitive students, and the support of parents and the community. We all work together to make our school a great place for learning and achievement.

Here are some of the outstanding accomplishments from this past school year:

- Ranked by the *U.S. News and World Report* in the **Top 10% Nation-wide** (out of more than 20,000 schools)
- **5 National Merit Scholars**
- **29 Super Scholars** – Accepted into a Top 20 College or University
- **68 Students** earned an **International Baccalaureate Diploma**
- Over **\$16 Million** in scholarships earned
- **3,583 AP and IB Exams** were administered to help students achieve college credits while in high school
- Ranked an **'A' School** by the Florida Department of Education
- **Digital Video Production** – numerous students received national recognition for both the C-SPAN Student Cam Documentary and the Student Television Network competitions.
- **Navy JROTC** – our FAA Certified Pilot Ground School has produced 6 pilots; 10 more students passed the FAA Certification for Drone Piloting; through a Dual Enrollment partnership with Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, our students continue to achieve college credits and industry certifications while in high school.
- **Performing Arts** – 115 student-performers made All-County; 12 made All-State; 54 Superiors at District Solo & Ensemble; 8 Superiors at State Solo & Ensemble – 2 of them with Distinction; Chorus selected as a Disney Candlelight Processional Honor Choir; numerous honors at community events for our Visual Arts program; Theater – award nominations for student performers in the production 'Crazy for You'; Dance Team achieved a State Championship and 5th in the Nation.
- **Athletics** – 3 Team and 1 Individual State Champions; 1 State Runner-up; 3 Region Champions; 12 State Top 10 Finishes; 13 District Champions; 28 out of 30 Varsity teams had an average GPA over 3.0; Metro Conference 'Bob Berry' All Sports Award; 2 Student-Athletes made the FHSAA Academic All-State Team

- **Freshman Orientation** – will take place on Wednesday, August 7, from 5 – 7 PM. We will have many of our clubs, sports teams, performing arts programs, and other extra-curricular programs available to provide information that will help all of our incoming freshman get involved. Research shows that students are more successful academically when they are involved in extra-curricular activities outside of the regular school day. Additionally, students/parents will be able to see where their seven classrooms are located and talk to their teachers.
- **Welcome Back Cats** - will be held on the main campus for seniors, juniors, and sophomores. These sessions are designed for students to pick up a schedule, receive or replace an ID badge, purchase a parking decal, and rent a locker.

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

## From Student Services

Our Student Services team is comprised of 8 school counselors, one SAFE coordinator, one College and Career Specialist, an AP/IB coordinator, two 504 coordinators, ESE placement specialists, and our amazing clerical staff. Our team strives to provide excellent support to all our students.

### ACADEMIC COUNSELING

Students will meet with their guidance counselor 3 times during the year to discuss graduation requirements, course selections, and general guidance lessons. Main Campus students will also visit the College and Career Center. Counselors are also available for individual appointments. Students can stop by the Student Services Office to schedule an appointment.

## COLLEGE AND CAREER CENTER

The College and Career Center of Winter Park High School provides the following services to students:

- Assistance with college, scholarship, and job applications

On behalf of the Winter Park High School International Baccalaureate faculty, I would like to welcome you to the 2019-20 school year and congratulate you on your decision to enroll in one of our two International Baccalaureate Programmes, or have decided to add an IB course to your schedule. We applaud your choice in a programme and courses which puts emphasis on educating the “whole person” and to use the life skills learned in high school to function successfully in college and in the work place after college. We strongly believe that the steps our students take today will help them shape their future tomorrow. The WPHS IB Programmes, and courses, aim to help young generations pave their own pathway. We would like to take a moment to congratulate our graduating class of 2019. They graduated with a high amount of scholarships and grants. They were accepted to a full range of colleges including Northwestern, Duke, Emory, US Naval Academy, Vanderbilt, UF, FSU, Belmont, UNC and Brown just to name a few. What is unique is all of the students will recognize the benefits of an IB education in college, and will receive college credit for courses. For those new to WPHS, we have two IB Programmes on campus. The IB Diploma Programme (DP) and the IB Career-related Programme (CP). The Diploma Programme has been in existence at WPHS for 33+ years and is world renown for being one of the strongest and most successful DP in central Florida (# 1) in the state (# 7), nationally and globally. The Career-related Programme just graduated their second cohort of seniors. We are extremely proud of both programmes and looking forward to watching them continue to grow and develop with our amazing students.

As mentioned above, YES, we are now offering IB courses to students not enrolled in either of our programmes. This is extremely exciting news for our school. The benefits of participation in either of our two IB programmes and IB courses are numerous. A college level of instruction from global perspectives, development of strong study skills, and encouragement of critical thinking are just a few. We believe that the culmination of this course work is the examination itself. We strongly encourage each student to fulfill every stage of his/her commitment to excellence. Taking the examinations will enable students to be prepared for college examinations, both oral and written, and may facilitate acceptance and/or advanced placement on the university level.
